LAMBERT'S WINERY

Located on top of a hill and surrounded by vineyard, this magnificent hand-cut stone winery features the best vintage wines in the Lewis County area. Lambert's Winery features winery tours and wine tasting in the magnificent tasting room. While visiting the winery, relax in the beautifully landscaped grounds including a pond and waterfall area or in the breezeway featuring a huge hand-cut stone fireplace and a variety of cozy rocking chairs. WVU JACKSON'S MILL

WVU Jackson's Mill has been a steadfast place of learning, leadership and growth for many over the last 87 years. Home to the State 4-H camp, WVU Jackson's Mill is also an important arena for adult education, special events, conferences and meetings as well as the home of the WV Fire Academy. The Historic Area has roots that go back to the 1800's. Three generations of Jackson's operated grist and sawmills on this site. The most remembered family member learning the family trades here later became

known as General "Stonewall" Jackson during the Civil War. The old gristmill is the last of the original buildings from the Jackson homestead. Tours, educational programs and special events are offered.



TRANS-ALLEGHENY LUNATIC ASYLUM

Located in the heart of Weston is the Trans-Allegheny Lunatic Asylum (TALA). Construction on this facility started in 1858 and was not completed until 1881. The Asylum was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1990. This is the largest hand-cut stone masonry building in North America, and is rumored the second largest in the world, next to the Kremlin. Designed to house only 250 souls, the hospital at one time housed 2400 in very overcrowded and generally poor conditions.

After years of stories, recently the Asylum was surveyed for her ghostly possibilities by Ghost Hunters/T. A. P. S. on the Sci Fi Channel, whom discovered and confirmed the Asylum's apparitions. The Asylum offers historic tours, ghost tours, and ghost hunts to the public, as well as special events on the grounds throughout the year.

THE MOUNTAINEER MILITARY MUSEUM

This breathtaking tribute to our country's veterans started as a simple promise to fallen friends: "I'll never forget". This promise bloomed into the museum which now serves to not only honor our country's veterans, who honorably served, but to teach our future generations about all the sacrifices that were made to ensure their freedom.

The displays reflect World Wars I and II, Korea, Vietnam, Desert Storm, Iraqi Freedom and the conflicts in between. There is no admission to the museum and they operate off donations only. Please visit and ask how you can honor your hero.

WEST VIRGINIA MUSEUM OF AMERICAN GLASS

With an extensive collection of handmade glass from 1900 to the 1970's, the museum also features contemporary and 19th century glass as well. The museum also preserves the history of the people and places who made these products. Examine the rich history of some of America's largest glass factories, while understanding the impact that the hundreds of smaller often-forgotten glass houses made on the industry.



STONEWALL JACKSON LAKE

Being the newest lake and park in the state of WV, The Stonewall Jackson Lake State Park has more to offer than meets the eye. The Visitors Center beneath the Stonewall Jackson Dam is full of interesting displays and information from around the area. The foot of the dam is also an excellent fishing hole, especially for trout. There are many superb fishing spots on and around the lake allowing you to enjoy year-round fishing. The park also offers public hunting lands perfect for obtaining that trophy buck, squirrel, duck, bear or turkey.

Every fall the park hosts "The National Hunting and Fishing Days." This event allows everyone to explore the park while also engaging in both the sports of hunting and fishing by attending seminars, classes, children's activities, vendors, and everything else imaginable that concerns either sport.



STONECOAL LAKE

Located in both Lewis and Upshur County, this lake provides some of the best Musky fishing in the state of WV.

There are many different fish that make Stonecoal Lake their home besides the ever-famous Musky, including Walleye, Bass, Trout, Carp and Catfish. All the species within the lake have furnished trophy-size fish. Stonecoal currently holds two state records for Muskies caught within her waters, this is a MUST fishing spot for any avid fisherman.
